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Press Release: Learn to code on a tropical island.

We all know that learning to code can give you an extra edge in a competitive job market, and is quickly becoming an essential skill in many industries. But learning to code can be challenging, with the existing options failing to meet the mark. A new player on the scene, Institute of Code, wants to teach you web-development on a tropical island. Institute of Code runs 10 day, all-inclusive code retreats teaching small groups of marketers, graphic designers, and entrepreneurs how to build responsive websites from scratch.

The problem with existing alternatives.

Many people try to teach themselves through trial and error and internet tutorials, but without someone there to help them when they get stuck and connect the dots to show the bigger picture it can take months to develop any practical skills. Community college courses are another option, but these courses are often teaching outdated technologies by teachers who haven't been active in the web-development field for years. For those that are looking to build a career out of web development, coding bootcamps are an excellent option but at 3 - 6 months, these are overkill for many people.

Why a 'Code Retreat'?

Learning to code is learning another language, and there is significant evidence to suggest that best way to learn a new language is to immerse yourself in it. For many people the idea of learning to code is intimidating, and if you are stressed about your day, or distracted by everything else that's going on in your life, you learn at a much slower pace. At the Institute of Code, everything is included, from the massage on arrival, the morning yoga classes, the meals cooked by an in-house chef, and accommodation in a beautiful pool villa. When we take care of all the little details, it frees up all your mental energy to focus on learning something new. Over 10 days with no stress or distractions, you can build momentum and develop practical skills fast.

We are also driven by a desire to make the most of every moment, and that means that education should be more than a means to an end, but a cherished experience in itself.

What the course will teach?

In short, our courses take someone with no prior coding experience and teach them how to build kick-ass responsive websites from scratch. By the end of the course you'll have a clear understanding of how the web works and how to write clean, efficient code in HTML, CSS, and Javascript. You'll have created a portfolio of 2-3 responsive websites (meaning they look great on mobiles + tablets), with features like galleries, sliders and contact forms, and css animations.

The course content is roughly equivalent to General Assembly's part-time Front End Web Development Course <https://generalassemb.ly/education/front-end-web-development>. Both include 60+ hours of tuition.

Founders Story

After starting a marketing agency in her second year of university, co-founder Tina Swinkels quickly recognized the demand for web-development skills. *"For a small business, a great website can be a huge asset — it's a 24 hour salesman that can be generating sales while you are sound asleep"* — Tina. Wanting to provide more value for her clients, she taught herself to code piecing together the knowledge through internet tutorials and trial and error. Two years later together with her co-founder Emile, she embarked on a 7 month backpacking trip, working barter deals for web development as they went along. *"Knowing how to code, combined with Emile's photography skills opened so many possibilities for us... we stayed for almost a month in a boutique resort on the coast of Peru, spent three weeks at a Jungle lodge in Panama, and completed a dive course on an island in Honduras just to name a few."*

When asked why someone should take a course rather than learn themselves online, Tina responded *'at the time, I opted for the DIY learning route because I didn't see any good alternatives. It was tough though, and what I learned over several months and lots of frustration, we're now teaching in 10 days. I look back at late nights struggling with CSS positioning or DNS settings, and know how much more effective it would have been to have been taught by an experienced mentor.'* — Tina
